EARLY LEARNING & CARE FINANCING & DATA COLLECTION

By 2030, Maine families with infants, toddlers, and preschoolers will have access to affordable, high quality early care and education in child care programs and elementary schools in partnership with home visitors, early childhood service providers, and employers.

By 2030, Maine will create a comprehensive and integrated early childhood system that functions as a public good with dedicated funding to ensure that children and families can thrive. The early childhood workforce is valued as a vital part of Maine's education system and economy. By 2030, establish a public funding mechanism to ensure that jobs in child care programs include benefits and competitive wages, commensurate with experience and credentials/degrees, reflecting the importance of the work.

Vision

By 2030 Maine will have an early childhood system with regional coordination and connection, with no wrong door for families to access services.

2020

Engaged in federal advocacy over Covid-19 that saw over \$50 billion in emergency funding dedicated to child care in the U.S.

History Timeline

Maine is piloting First4ME in four communities.

2021

Legislation passed to begin up to 5 First4ME programs across Maine based on the Skowhegan ElevateME project and implement Help ME Grow. Pre-K expands through covid grant funding.

2022

7,500 educators

Legislation passed to provide \$200 monthly wage supplements to educators working in licensed child care programs

2023-2024

A Pre-K Commission was created to provide suggestions to the Education Committee regarding the expansion of publicly funded pre-K, focusing on full-day programs with a mixed delivery approach.


WHAT WAS ADDED IN THE BUDGET?

Head Start Eligibility

Initiative: Provides funding for delivery of Head Start services to support families earning up to 185% of the federal poverty level.

Child Care Affordability for Educators

Initiative: Provides funding to include child care staff in the Maine Child Care Affordability Program.

ECE WAGES

Initiative: Provides funding to double the monthly wage supplement for all child care workers.

Child Care Affordability Eligibility

Initiative: Provides funding to increase eligibility for child care subsidies from 85% of the State's median income to 125% of the State's median income.




