Majority Vote	Consensus	Unanimous
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 51% are in favor or against a decision	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Dialogue focused to include diverse perspectives, collaborative, and the process is about coming into alignment and/or agreement in favor or against a decision.• Requires active participation• Can be time consuming	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 100% agreement favor or against a decision• “All or nothing”
Supermajority Vote	Compromise	Delegation
<ul style="list-style-type: none">• 66% are in favor or against a decision	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A settlement of differences in perspectives, experience, and/or values, and the process is about coming to a mutual point of agreement focused on how to move forward• Common process leaned upon when tension and/or conflict surfaces	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• A role and/or group are empowered to determine in favor or against a decision• Clarity infrastructure can clarify who is empowered to make decisions and what process ought to be used
