  - Orientation- Session that provides overview of coalition, current goals, strategy and campaign
  - Attend coalition meetings

  - Sign a MOU- A written agreement that outlines the expectations and terms of engagement in this coalition. Also notes details of who is fiscally responsible and where any monies ought to be paid/stewarded

      - If yes, what does this look like?
      - If not, why not? OR Has this been considered?
- Who are leads and what are their responsibilities? Chair, Co-chairs, Executive Committee
  - o How was leadership established when this coalition started?
  - Who is currently in leadership and how long have they been serving in this role?
  - How sustainable are maintaining leadership responsibilities?
- Who manages this coalition?
  - Organizational staff person
  - o contracted facilitator or coordinator
  - Shared organizational staff
  - Community leaders
  - o Other
